Jamieson A. Smith, a United Statestional, is the Chief Suspension and Debarm Officer (the "SDO" I R U the World Bank.

Mr. Smith heads the World Bank's Office of Suspension and Debarm (MDSD"), which is an independent unit within the Bank and the first tier of the Bank's two detred adjudicative anctions system. The SDO is tasked with impartially riewing accusations of fraud, corruption and collusion against respondent firmand individuals brought by the Bank's Integrity Vice Presidency ("INT"). For each ase, Mr. Smith determines twether there is sufficient vidence to suspend the ontracting eligibility of the respondents. In deciding consest the SDO doesnot take instructions from any other person or unit.
